Virginia Festival of the Book:

In March 2015, WVPT partnered with the Virginia Foundation for the Humanities for the annual **Virginia Festival of the Book** celebration in Chrlottesville. For over ten years, WVPT has held a children's literacy event in conjunction with the Festival that presents a special children's program and distributes free books. This year, the station aired two episodes of **Daniel Tiger's Neighborhood**, and hosted a meet and greet with PBS Kid's character, Hooper, and our very own Cubby, the WVPT Bear. Over 500 children and family members attended the event and we look forward to another successful event in 2016.



Share Fair Nation:

WVPT was invited by the Share Fair Nation organization and their Virginia host site, Bridgewater College, to participate in their second annual event which focuses on STEM education for elementary and middle school students and their teachers. WVPT served as the official media sponsor for the event where teachers gained professional development opportunities to bring science, math and technology into their classrooms and children experienced interactive activities and experiments. WVPT presented the station's mobile Green Screen Studio for teachers, students and parents, sharing the science behind the Green Screen technology.
