Narrative Statement (WVPT-WVPY)

The employment unit comprised of noncommercial education television station WVPT (Staunton, VA) and its satellite station WVPY (Front Royal, VA) has undertaken a number of measures to achieve broad and inclusive outreach in disseminating information throughout the communities that it serves about specific station employment opportunities as well as about broadcasting in general.

As reflected in the two attached Annual EEO Public File Reports, the employment unit has developed a recruitment source list that includes an array of sources designed to disseminate note of job vacancies widely within the community. During the 2-year period prior to filing the application, the unit has had only one full-time opening. The unit promoted this opening through the local newspaper *Daily News-Record* with a circulation of over 30,000. It also provided notification of the opening to a number of local educational institutions (*e.g.*, James Madison University, Eastern Mennonite University, Radford University, Mary Baldwin College, Bridgewater college and Blue Ridge Community College) and organizations (*e.g.*, Working Women's Forum and John Mann United Methodist Church). In addition, it utilized the widely used Internet job bank for broadcast employment tvjob.com. as well as job postings at PBS, CPB, The Society of Broadcast Engineers and the Virginia Association of Broadcasters.

As further reflected in the two recent Annual EEO Public File Reports, the WVPT-WVPY unit engaged in various supplemental outreach initiatives from the FCC's Menu of such activities. Over the past two years, such outreach endeavors have included, for example, establishing and maintaining an active intern program designed to help students develop skills in broadcasting. The unit also participated in the Goodwill Industries Employment Program and the Federal Work Study Program, helping prepare individuals for future work in broadcasting. In addition, the unit participated in career and job fairs, conducted station tours to provide information about NCE television broadcasting, and provided job training for existing employees.
